Online Activity

Children's online activity can have a big impact on their wellbeing and learning at school. We often deal with online issues that have occurred on the weekends or afterschool. These usually include name calling, exclusion from chats and general 'meanness' to others in group chats/apps/games. Most of the time this occurs when using a platform or app that is not designed for primary school children, that is with an age limit of 13+.

PLEASE monitor your child's online activity at home, we cannot do so, but we do deal with consequences of inappropriate use. Working through these issues takes a lot of time and can affect children's wellbeing. We encourage all children/families to screenshot inappropriate online behaviour and/or report it to the app/website.


Students should seek the assistance of other nearby adults if they feel unsafe and should report the event to a trusted adult (parent or school staff member) as soon as possible.


