Vicky and Nikki have always prepared great activities for our youngest members of our community. Playgroup runs every Friday from 9.15-10.30am in the Preschool. No bookings necessary!

Next week we have our Parent/Teacher Conversations. Please ensure you have made a booking to meet with your child's teacher. A strong partnership between school and home is very important for your child's wellbeing and learning. These conversations give parents/carers a chance to discuss learning progress and for teachers to share celebrations of learning and areas for future focus or intervention.

Throughout the school, students are engaging in the Child Protection Curriculum. As a community, it is timely to also remind parents/carers of some safety tips to discuss with children in an age-appropriate way.

Students and families are reminded to be wary of approaches from strangers, especially when they are unaccompanied or travelling to and from school. If they are approached students should not respond and should not accept offers of rides or gifts.

Students should seek the assistance of other nearby adults if they feel unsafe and should report the event to a trusted adult (parent or school staff member) as soon as possible.

SAPOL advises that taking out a mobile phone and calling police can deter the offender and they recommend the student making a formal report to their closest police station.

Attendance Matters!

Of course, children get sick from time to time and it is important that they stay home if they are unwell. Please call 8245 5855, email absent@smms.catholic.edu.au or SMS 0407 682 137 anytime.

Did you realise that by missing just 5 days each term, it is very difficult for your child to achieve their best at school. The research has found that it does not matter why your child is away from school, their non-attendance affects their educational learning.

Missing school affects your child's learning, their ability to make and keep friends, and their sense of belonging to a class group or the school community.

Research conducted in Australia has also found that if a student misses 10% of days each school year, this will affect their NAPLAN results in Year 3.

7	Your child's attendance is on or above 95% They are likely to be a "Star Attendee". They will almost certainly achieve the best grades for their ability and have real opportunity in further education or in the world of work.
	Your child's attendance is 90-94% "GREEN for GO" for good attendance. This will give them real opportunities for continuing their studies or in the world or work.
	Your child's attendance is 85-89% "AMBER - Take Care" as students will be missing up to 20 days each year this will make it very difficult for them to achieve their best.
	Your child's attendance is 80-84% "RED light - Be Alert" as students are missing so much school it will be very difficult for them to keep in touch with lessons or with their friends.
	Your child's attendance is below 80% "AT RISK - Immediate Action Needed" as students are missing so much time from school it will be almost impossible for them to keep in touch with lessons or with work.

Studies have also shown that it is important to set positive school attendance habits early, which includes Preschool and the early years of school. There is a strong link between regular attendance at Preschool and literacy levels in Year 3. It is important to set positive school attendance habits early!

At St Margaret Mary's School and Preschool, we work hard to create a welcoming school community for all students and their families, and to provide a learning environment that is safe, inclusive and values positive relationships. This is one way that we can support children and their families to attend school every day!

At the end of the day we gathered in prayer and the students reflected that they demonstrated leadership by preparing soup and that when we do something for others like the homeless, we feel happy too.

We look forward to joining the Whitefriars Year 6 students, teachers and APRIM Josh Page as we continue on our three day experience. 


